July 14, 1965

President Johnson signs the Older Americans Act.

1965

December 27, 1971

Council on Aging of the Cincinnati Area incorporates as a non-profit serving Boone, Campbell and Kenton counties in KY and Clermont and Hamilton counties in OH.

1975

1977

COA holds first Senior Expo, a tradition that continued for 33 years.

1986

PASSPORT begins. For the first time, Ohio seniors have an in-home alternative to nursing home care.

1985

1991

COA celebrates 20 years: 92 staff members and annual budget of \$13 million.

1970

Council on Aging (COA) begins as a Community Chest Project with three staff members and a budget of \$40,000.

1974

State of Ohio designates COA the Area Agency on Aging for Butler, Clermont, Clinton, Hamilton and Warren counties.

1981

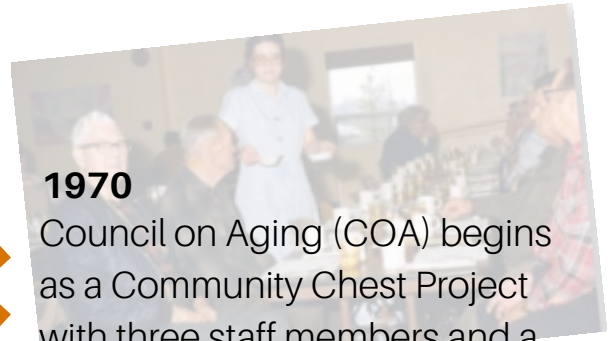
COA celebrates 10 years: 36 staff members and annual budget of \$10 million.
