Expand Services – levy – to more people
Provide more transport to activities for socialization
Outreach efforts to identify and assist Seniors
Making community hubs for resources in the community
Advocacy for more funding/programs – I think there needs to be a system change at the state and federal level
Coordinate services & service providers – more home care options.
Develop financial education/support/counseling program to expand seniors ability to pay and plan
More advocacy
Ongoing work to improve the societal perception of the utility and value of aging individuals (i.e. public service, volunteer opportunities)
Strengthen connections and support from industry/local companies financially and with volunteers
Set strategic vision/direction to identify the key needs within our region. This will allow agencies to align servers to the greatest needs
Informing public about COA and what programs are available
Investigate partnerships with organizations that specialize in certain needed areas of concern. Example, Alzheimer's Association for educational materials and classes, etc.
Policy changes to increase funding for in-home care.
Think about strategies to engage older adults who want to work/volunteer – possibly in provision of assistance to older adults who need it. Volunteer driver? Errand runners?
Communication of services available connecting with those in need
Educate families on services available. Where do you find people to educate? PSA for families who may not have the need yet

#1 Priority Action for Council on Aging - Continued
Develop some programs that sends people to seniors homes to help
Providing information – a challenge of getting services to older adults or letting them know that the service exists. Need to find new and innovative ways to integrate the information to places older adults will access it
Spearhead collective impact on transportation
Expand cooperative partnerships with community organizations to stretch resources and be "in time" with unique communities
Continued education to public
Assist in coordinating services such as transportation
Transportation planning
Convene at single point of contact
Knowledge of social media meetup.com
Communication plan/support for communities

#2 Priority Action for Council on Aging
Offer appropriate post -acute services . Transition of care services – get right care –right time – right location
Work with national chains to develop programs that will deliver food and meds to seniors living alone
Support efforts of senior centers who are working to provide preventive programming
Volunteer organizations for i.e. cut grass, shovel snow
Expand networks of communication and repair options to expand awareness, insure quality work, and fair price
More partnering – like groups collaboration in sharing best practices.
Advocacy work toward increasing amount of portion of dollars allotted to aging care through waivers and other sources of funding
Focus on contributions that older adults can make well into their later years
Gather funding/be leader in finding new funding instead of each group focus on funding COA can provide strategic direction/leadership to gain more regional funding
Helping people understand this is a service – not a charity
Reach out to program already in place to support seniors through community neighborhood groups and church ministry programs to highlight and communicate to senior and caregivers their existence
Workforce development for home health and home aides
Think about an "Angies List" of vetted providers who could be trusted to serve older adults
Community activation around priorities
Educate the public on the need to support services provided by COA. Show cost (tax) benefits. Levy?
Expand public transportation

#2 Priority Action for Council on Aging - Continued
Innovative partnerships – look for partners and solutions for needs that may not be "normal" part of aging network
Expand progress to improve health
The need for in-home caregivers will only become more challenging. Innovative caregiver solutions, i.e. tax breaks for family caregivers, respect for career
Explore differences between seniors and influences why obvious we don't know better as professionals but how to make the future more realistic – hope for the best, plan for the worst
Funding across the board
More support for seniors living at home
Accounts from the Complete Com
Aggregate/template for what services are needed
Household maintenance
Trouserroid maintenance
Promote needs for senior to the region at large – public service message

#3 Priority Action for Council on Aging
Offer/cover more health care related services, supplies, meds, etc.
Develop more organizations that will modify, adopt, and maintain homes, "partnering"
Decentralize some things
Increase education on the importance of future planning and financial planning
Continue to pursue how to share data gathered from home health visits with local hospitals, PCP's, payors, etc.
Connect agencies to better leverage current community resources. Many agencies are competing with each other
Offer referral service when called for help
Formalize an extensive network of home maintenance providers that specialize in senior housing remodification of kitchens, bathrooms, ramps, etc.
Transportation in suburban/rural areas: Patient to services, and bringing services to patients (nurses, dentists, pharmacists, physical therapy, meals, cooking, haircuts, etc.
Assessment of needs and POA for future needs
Continue to provide in-home care
Organize seminars about financial education
